Working session 1: Developing an African-centric concept of a Digital Innovation Hub and mapping opportunities for cooperation at a cross-continental scale

Sub-group 1 will develop an African-centric concept of a DIH. Using as references the experience gained by partners in AEDIB|NET and other projects as well as inspiration from the morning presentations and the DIH concept developed in Europe, the aim is to narrow down what it means to be a DIH in an African context and what building blocks are required to create an African DIH: vision and role in the ecosystem, consortium and governance, services and business models, etc.

Sub-group 2 will map the needs, interests and opportunities for cooperation at a cross-continental scale. Building on the connections that took place in the project and the matchmaking organized in the weeks ahead of the Summit, this group will clarify the main expectations about cooperation between African and European DIHs, which can serve as a basis to shape formats of concrete collaboration.

Working Session 2: Supporting DIHs and ecosystems in AEDIB 2.0

How can DIHs and the innovation ecosystem be supported by donors, investors, and other institutions in the future? This working session will look at a few concrete proposals and discuss them to come up with recommendations.

Working session 3: Driving Entrepreneurship Policy Reform, an introduction to Decision Thinking

Working Session 4: Innovative funding under AEDIB 2.0

Access to finance is a key element in the development of entrepreneurs at a very early stage. The first investment is always difficult to find because of the high rate of risk, but it is also necessary to build an MVP and validate the product-market fit in order to move on to the next stages. Rather than the support offered by friends and family, there are now new opportunities to obtain a small entry ticket: business angels, crowdfunding, loans of honor, etc. The aim of this panel will be to demystify these new tools by inviting those who offer them to tell us about their experiences.

16:30-17:30 Panel Discussion: What lies ahead for DIHs and innovation ecosystems in Africa

This discussion will aim at exploring the future of digital ecosystems in Africa through the learnings of the day. What is the role of DIHs? How will they build bridges between regions and continents? What would a pan-African network require from different stakeholders to efficiently promote and support innovation at scale while adapting to each ecosystem?
